As the Australian Council of State School Organisations (ACSSO), we are the voice for the interests of the families and communities of more than 2.55 million children attending government schools in Australia.

We are one of the oldest continuously operating parent organisations in Australia and indeed one of the oldest in the world.

ACSSO was formed in 1947 to provide, at a national level, policies, and multiple opportunities for families to be involved in the education of their children.

We believe that the primary obligation of governments, both Federal and State, is to establish and maintain government systems of education which:

- engage with family and community at all levels of education;
- are of the highest standard and open to all, irrespective of race, gender, religion, social-economic status, geographic location, or ability;
- can respond to the changing landscape of education in the 21st Century and respond and develop flexible and diverse programs necessary to meet student needs;
- discriminates in favour of those schools and individual students who are challenged with disadvantage and/or disability.

Is a partnership of students, parents and teachers in school and system decision making.

Students should, as a result of schooling, have the knowledge, skills, and understandings necessary to shape their own lives and to participate effectively in shaping society.

This will enable students to learn how to learn throughout their lives for the benefit of themselves and others.

Government education must develop among all students a sense of justice, empathy, respect, and concern for others.
