

Families like to know who the school leadership team are and who will be responsible for their children

CREATE A WELCOMING AND FRIENDLY ENVIRONMENT

First impressions are lasting memories, a welcoming environment can be felt as soon as families enter the school "It's amazing how a smile makes the difference"

COFFEE AND CHAT TIME

Conduct a "COFFEE & CHAT" time after the session to get to know families in an informal environment

LEARN SOMETHING NEW

Take the opportunity to use the session to;

gain information from the family so the school is ready for the child

to enhance the skills of families to support their child's learning

enable families & school staff to work in partnership and what that looks like in your school, rather than just providing information
